Chapters/Cycles	Criteria (what you need to do after reading)
One	READ the assigned pages. IDENTIFY one character and CREATE a bubble map that will describe them. USE what the author, other characters, or the narrator says about them, to DESCRIBE their appearance (age, height, nationality, gender, appearance, etc.). In the middle circle, underneath the character's name, IDENTIFY the character's role. As time progresses and as more and more characters are introduced, the students will change characters to describe.
Two	<b>READ</b> the assigned pages. <b>SELECT</b> the character that you did a bubble map on from the previous chapter. <b>INFER</b> the character's personality based on their actions. <b>USE</b> the same tools as you did previously (author, narrator, other characters, etc.) to help. <b>FIND</b> evidence from the text to prove how you came to the conclusion that the character has this type of personality.
Three	<b>READ</b> the assigned pages. <b>LIST</b> 5 or more words that are unfamiliar to you. <i>Keep a list of all the vocabulary words that you list.</i>
Four	<b>READ</b> the assigned pages. <b>IDENTIFY</b> the setting. <b>WRITE</b> all examples of setting there are in this chapter and give a visual example of that setting.
Five	READ the assigned pages. SUM UP the five chapters you have read this week by CREATING a plot diagram. On the diagram start filling in the exposition, and rising action with details from this week. USE character names and discuss any new characters or new roles a character may have and new settings. Also, add any complications that may contribute to the conflict. Leave room on your diagram to fill out more details as you read more of the book. (This is when we will discuss whether your character is remaining the same [static] or is going through a major transformation [dynamic])

<sup>\*\*\*</sup>Once you are done with the first five assigned readings, start over for each chapter/assigned pages. This will repeat until the book is done. I will check this at the end of every week.
